

Primary School:

Greetings and welcome to our first newsletter of 2024 where we will keep you informed of all that is happening in the Primary school. Our year has started off to a rocking start and we are full swing into teaching and learning!

Parents' Information Evenings:

We held information sessions with parents from grade 1 to grade 7. These meetings were fruitful and well attended. A heartfelt thanks to those parents who took the time to attend. For those who were unable to attend, the teachers have shared the information on the WhatsApp groups. Please familiarise yourself with the content.

Communication:

Please ensure that you have D6 and that you are on the WhatsApp class group, as these are the platforms via which important communication takes place. If your child is absent or needs to be fetched early, you must communicate with the <u>class register teacher</u>.

Baseline assessments:

The Gr 1-7 learners have completed the baselines and learners who require extra support have been identified. These learners will receive an invitation to attend the intervention classes.

Intercom:

As mentioned, teaching and learning is ongoing and our learners have a lot of content they must cover before the assessments begin. Therefore, we appeal to parents to avoid picking up learners early or bringing forgotten items to the office which necessitates the use of the intercom. Not only are you taking learners out of class when they should be learning, but you are also disturbing other learners.

Drop-off zones:

Traffic is a huge problem, especially in the mornings and afternoons. Therefore, there are specific drop-off and pick-up points allocated to the different grades.

Grade 1 – 4: Top gate (Main Parking lot)

Gr 5-7 - Bottom gate

Learners from grade 5 -7 who have siblings in Grade RRR to Grade 3 have been given special tags that will allow them to be fetched at the Top Gate.

For safety reasons, we urge parents to pick up children as soon as possible as staff are only on duty till 2: 45 pm and security cannot be held responsible for the learners' welfare/ safety.

Home Learning Reminders:

Parents and learners of grade 4-7 will receive a Home Learning reminder weekly. Not only will this have a list of homework that learners have to complete, but it will also contain a list of teachers' contact details. Please take note of who is teaching your child this year and reach out if you have concerns/queries. Grade 1-3 will receive homework grids weekly instead of a Home Learning Reminder. They also receive a monthly reminder.

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




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
