#### **Primary School Culture News:**

Dear Parents / Guardians

With the cultural activities in full speed, the learners are settling into their perspective activities, and enjoying every minute of it! **Public Speaking** - During Public Speaking in Term 1 we have focused on two main areas: speaking in front of an audience and writing an argumentative orators speech. On the speaking side we have looked at how you can use your voice, facing the fear of being in front of an audience and how to use your hands and move your body on the stage. When writing the speech we have focused on choosing a topic, developing a structure and how to form arguments.

**Art** - Let's explore some exciting activities for Grade 1 - 3 learners. Thus far, the learners have embarked on a creative journey, starting with drawing self-portraits of themselves. These self-portraits allow them to express their unique personalities and perspectives. Building on their artistic skills, they've also honed their cutting and pasting abilities by creating a delightful fish. The process of assembling different shapes and colors to form a fish encourages creativity and fine motor development. And what better way to celebrate love and friendship



than by crafting Valentine's Day cards. The Grade 1 - 3 learners have poured their hearts into making heartfelt cards, spreading joy and affection to their loved ones. Being the month of love, last week they took a break from sketching to create beautiful valentine cards using water colour paper and water colour painting techniques. The Grade 4-7 learners also experimented with the theme of love during their previous lessons.

**Dance** - The Grade 1 - 3 Dance Crew are learning something new this year - cultural dancing! "Even the most beautiful flower withers in time." - Zulu proverb! The dancers have been introduced to a new dance style this year. They are learning an IsiZulu dance. For the remainder of the term, the dancers will continue to practice this expressive and rhythmic dance style. Whereas the Grade 4 - 7 hip hop dance group has decided to unveil another style to the party - the Amapiano group!

**Hindu Student Council (HSC)** - We are so thrilled to have your kids join us at HSC. For the past two weeks we have been engaging our learners in arts and crafts, a creative way to get the year started! Our students have created the flag of India in commemoration of the Inauguration of the Ram Mandir which was recently built in Ayodhya.

Christian Student Council - During CSC, Mrs Ramdeo ministers to the learners at their level of understanding of Christianity. The session for the Grade 1 - 3 learners include prayer, worship and Bible stories. With the Grade 4 - 7 learners Mrs Ramdeo has covered the topic of LOVE over the past few weeks. She focused on 1 Corinthians 13 and shared about the unconditional, AGAPE love of Jesus Christ. They are taught how to pray, share testimonies of how the Word has impacted their lives in the week following, how to witness to their friends, how to do devotions and how to display the character of Jesus Christ in their daily lives.

**Marimbas** - Marimbas is officially in full swing with the selection process concluded and learners are becoming more familiar with the instrument. The first lessons served as an introduction to handling of the beaters, learning and playing basic notes and scales.

**Drama -** The Grade 1 - 3 drama learners have been studying a poem about verbs over the last few weeks. They have incorporated the poem with actions as well. They are learning how to be in sync with each other as well as doing movements in opposite directions. The Grade 4 - 7 drama learners have currently been focusing on Role Playing during their lessons. Role play demonstrates how to use language in real life with a focus on communication. Role play benefits: motivates and engages students.



**Singing** - The singing learners started working on their group song. Every Tuesday going forward for this term the learners will work on the group song. Learners also learned about the importance of breathing, posture and projection.

All cultural activities will continue as per usual during the course of the term, and end on the 15th of March 2025.

### **Therapy News:**

#### IS TOO MUCH SCREEN TIME MESSING WITH YOUR HEAD?



Technology is on the rise in all age groups - from toddlers to pre-schoolers, to middle childhood ages, to adolescents and adults. It is no wonder that toddlers and pre-schoolers are introduced to screens before they are introduced to books. Recent research estimates that ninety percent (90%) of adolescents use social media both day and night.

In the course of my therapeutic interventions with young people that span a few decades; there is noticeably a marked increase in depression, anxiety, stress, suicidal ideation, self-injury, eating disorders, sleeplessness, attention and concentration disorders, poor academic performance, emotional numbness and aggression. Could "digital cocaine" be partly or largely responsible for this?

Many young people confirm that they spend hours on their devices. Parents confirm that their children are "too much" on their phones.

"Digital Cocaine refers to smart devices we use tirelessly; repression, restriction and restraint of which leads to mental, emotional and psychological breakdown which sporadically leads to depression amongst other factors." – Daniel Ayuba.

The reason why it is compared to cocaine and heroin is because of the similar pattern of addiction that is formed in the brain when smart devices are abused. Excess dopamine is released in areas of the brain that are responsible for decision-making processes as well as higher mental processes causing a euphoric sensation that leaves you begging for more screen time. When children are left to their own devices (excuse the pun), children will always opt for the screen instead of schoolwork.

#### WHAT PARENTS CAN DO?

- Monitor your and your children's emotional states.
- Model appropriate lifestyle and behaviour patterns. Walk the talk.
- Limit screen time by taking the device away for reversal of the addiction to be possible.
- Introduce more time for family interaction, play hard in nature, laugh and talk more about all sorts of topics that are relevant for emotional and mental growth.
